Faith Outreach Intern

The Faith Outreach Internship is a full-time summer internship for current students with an interest in climate action, faith outreach within the Mennonite Church and coalition building.

The student will support the work of the Center for Sustainable Climate Solutions and Mennonite Creation Care Network by building relationships with congregations open to climate action. Communications, networking and administrative tasks will make up the bulk of the work day. The Faith Outreach Internship is based in Wolf Lake, Indiana, and includes housing and a monthly stipend.

Responsibilities:	Research - 10% Assist Director of Pastoral Ecology with research and Monitoring and Evaluation related Pastoral retreats and work with MCCN on interviewing church leaders on climate change. Logistics - 35% Assist Director of Pastoral Ecology with logistics for events such as Pastoral Retreat, and MennoCon2019. Outreach - 30% Reach out to congregations that may be interested in joining MCCN and connecting with CSCS. Writing/Communication - 25% Assist with communication tasks such as maintaining the MCCN Facebook page and finding resources for the newsletter. As well as writing feature stories for Mennonite Creation Care Network and CSCS and creating resources for CSCS website and subscribers.
